* Until 1907, the Governor in Council had the power under the provision of section 41 of the *Constitution Act 1889*, to fix different dates for election in the different district. According to Section 71(3) of the *Electoral Act 1907* the same date shall be fixed for the polling in each region or district, as the case requires, however elections for northern seats were still held separately until 1930.

State General Election Dates - Legislative Council

Year

- 1832 The first sitting of the Legislative Council was held on 7 February 1832. The first constituted Legislative Council consisted of five official members nominated by, and including, the Governor.
- 1870 Under the terms of the *Australian Colonies Government Act 1850*, twelve elected councillors, together with six nominated by the Governor, three official and three non-official, formed the Legislative Council.
- 1887 By 1887, the Legislative Council had increased to a total of twenty six members.
- 1894 The first fully elective Legislative Council was elected on 16 July 1894. Twenty-one members were elected, three from each of seven provinces, one to retire every two years. Enrolment to vote was based on a restricted property franchise.
- 1965 Commencing from 1965, conjoint State General Elections were held for the Legislative Assembly and Legislative Council.

Preferential Voting System

Preferential voting is a system whereby a candidate must poll an absolute majority of the total formal votes (ie in excess of 50%) in order to be elected to the vacancy.

Under a full preferential system, a voter is required to indicate a preference for each candidate on the ballot paper by using the numbers 1, 2, 3 and so on up to the number of candidates. If, after all first preference votes have been counted, no candidate has obtained an absolute majority of all formal votes, then the candidate with the fewest number of first preference votes is excluded from the count. The excluded candidate's second preference votes are then distributed to the remaining candidates at this stage.

If, after that exclusion, no candidate has obtained an absolute majority of formal votes, the next remaining candidate with the fewest votes is excluded and all of his or her votes (second preferences and those received from the previously excluded candidate) are distributed to the remaining candidates.

The above process is continued until one candidate is elected by obtaining an absolute majority of formal votes. The absolute majority is calculated excluding informal and exhausted votes. An example of the above process is shown below for the District of Eyre.

Step 1

The absolute majority at this stage of the count is 3,706. As no candidate has achieved this on first preference votes, Williams, the candidate with the fewest number of first preference votes is excluded. The excluded candidate's second preference votes are then distributed to the remaining candidates. These votes are then added to the remaining candidates' progressive totals. Exhausted votes are formal; however, these are not added to any candidate's total as no consecutive preference has been indicated for the remaining e.g. 1,2,2,2 or 1,2,3,3.

Step 2

At this stage of the count, the absolute majority is now 3,699. As no candidate has yet achieved this, Smith, the candidate with the fewest number of votes following the first distribution (1,570) is next to be excluded. The excluded candidate's second preference votes from the first preferences (1,310) are then distributed to the remaining candidates. The third preference votes from the first distribution (260) are also distributed to the remaining candidates. These votes are then added to their progressive total.

Step 3

As there are only two candidates remaining, the candidate with the absolute majority is elected. The absolute majority at this stage of the count is now 3,673, with the 67 exhausted votes having the effect of reducing the absolute majority.

Result

John Bowler (ALP) is elected as the member for Eyre with a majority of 579 votes.

Proportional Representation Voting System

Proportional Representation

This is a voting system used in multi-member electorates which is designed to ensure that the number of successful candidates from each party and independents reflects as closely as possible the total vote received as a proportion of all the valid votes cast in an election. To be successful, a candidate is required to receive enough votes to reach a quota (not an absolute majority) which is based on the number of formal votes and the number of candidates to be elected. The Legislative Council of the Parliament of Western Australia is elected using a proportional representation system.

In very general terms, under the notion of proportional representation, if a party or candidate receives 40% of the formal vote, that party or candidate will gain 40% of the seats in the parliament. Thus if a political party received 40% of the vote in the North Metropolitan Region, it could expect to gain 3 of the 7 seats allocated to this region.

The quota required is calculated using the following formula:

$$\frac{\text{Number of formal votes per region}}{(\text{Number of MLCs to be elected per region} + 1)} + 1 = \text{quota required}$$

For example:

North Metropolitan Region

$$\frac{318,627}{(7+1)} + 1 = 39,829$$

In this example for the North Metropolitan Region, a candidate would need at least 39,829 votes to be elected. Note: the fraction $\frac{318,627}{8}$ is rounded down before the 1 is added to obtain the quota required ie. 39,829.

Surplus Votes

Candidates who receive a number of votes equal to or greater than the quota, are elected immediately. Any votes of these elected candidates which are surplus to the quota are transferred to the remaining candidates at a reduced value known as a transfer value. The transfer value is calculated as follows:

$$\frac{\text{Candidate's number of surplus votes}}{\text{Total number of ballot papers the candidate received}} = \text{transfer value}$$

Excluding Candidates

If at any stage there are no candidates with a surplus of votes and not all Council seats have been filled, the candidate with the fewest votes is excluded from the count.

The excluded candidate's ballot papers are distributed to the remaining candidates at the same vote value as they were received. In some counts this will mean ballot papers are transferred at the value of 1 while others will have various transfer values.

This process of distributing surplus votes from elected candidates and excluding the candidate with the fewest votes is continued until all vacancies are filled.

Legislative Council Re-Counts since 1996 State General Election

1997 North Metropolitan Region Re-Count – Resignation of the Hon. Philip Ross Lightfoot MLC

The Acting Electoral Commissioner was informed by His Excellency the Governor on 22 May 1997 that, due to the resignation of the Hon. Philip Ross Lightfoot, the seat of the Legislative Council of Western Australia for the North Metropolitan Region, to which he had been elected, was vacant.

Following this notification, the Acting Electoral Commissioner placed a notice in *The West Australian* and the *Weekend Australian* on 24 May 1997 advising that a vacancy existed. The 1993 vacancy no longer existed at the time official notice was received from the Governor on 22 May 1997 as its term had expired. Nominations closed at 12 noon on Tuesday, 3 June 1997. Three nominations had been received at that time.

The nominees for the purpose of this re-count were (in the order that their names appeared on the 1996 ballot paper):

Accordingly, the only candidates who could be declared elected at the re-count were the three who nominated on this occasion. Under the provisions of section 156D of the Act a full re-count of all ballot papers cast in the most recent Legislative Council election, on 14 December 1996, commenced following the close of nominations on Tuesday, 3 June 1997.

The count was conducted pursuant to Schedule 1 of the Act. As votes at the 1996 State General Election were counted electronically using a software program, a re-count was required to be conducted in the same manner pursuant to section 156D (4) of the *Electoral Act 1907*, having regard for the exclusion of the Hon Ross Lightfoot.

The count commenced at 12.30pm on 3 June 1997. The vacancy was filled approximately ten minutes later. At the completion of the computer count shortly thereafter, Raymond James Halligan was officially declared elected by the Acting Electoral Commissioner. A print-out of the count was obtained for record purposes. The whole process took approximately one hour, compared with the usual three weeks for a manual count. A summary of the count appears on the following pages.

Future re-counts resulting from the 1996 State General Election will also be conducted by automated means. This should see all future re-counts conducted on the day of close of nominations with results available shortly thereafter.

1997 Agricultural Region Re-Count – Resignation of the Hon. Eric Charlton MLC

On 29 July 1998, the Electoral Commissioner was notified by His Excellency the Governor that the Hon. Eric Charlton MLC, Member for the Agricultural Region, had resigned his position on 28 July 1998. The vacancy was advertised in accordance with section 156C (1) (a) on 30 July 1998. At the close of nominations, 12 noon on Monday, 10 August 1998 only one valid nomination had been received.

The Electoral Commissioner duly declared, in accordance with section 156D (3) (a) that, as there had only been one consenting candidate, Dexter Melvyn Davies was elected to the Legislative Council for the Agricultural Region.

2000 South Metropolitan Region Re-Count – Resignation of the Hon. Stanley (John) Halden MLC

On 25 January 2000, the Electoral Commissioner was notified by His Excellency the Governor that the Hon. Stanley (John) Halden MLC, Member for the South Metropolitan Region, had resigned his position on 20 January 2000. The vacancy was advertised in accordance with section 156C (1) (a) on 28 January 2000. At the close of nominations, 12 noon on Monday, 7 February 2000 two valid nominations had been received.

The nominating candidates were:

Immediately following the close of nominations a re-count of the votes from the 1996 State General Election was conducted. On the initial re-count Geoffrey Roy Donegan, a non-participating candidate, was the next candidate elected. As Mr Donegan had not nominated for the re-count he was ineligible. A further re-count of the votes was conducted, with Graham Thomas Giffard the successful candidate. A summary of the count appears on the following pages.

As Mr Giffard had nominated for the re-count, the Electoral Commissioner duly declared, in accordance with section 156D (8) (a) that Graham Thomas Giffard was elected to the Legislative Council for the South Metropolitan Region.
